#### **Precautionary Statements**

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Prevention: Keep away from heat, sparks, open flames, hot surfaces - no smoking. Keep container tightly

closed. No release into water. Use explosion-proof equipment. Use only non-sparking tools. Take precautionary measures against static discharge. Wash thoroughly after handling. Wear

protective gloves, eye protection, and face protection.

Response: IF SWALLOWED: Immediately call a physician or poison control center. If on skin (or hair):

#### 4. FIRST AID MEASURES

**Inhalation:** Move to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is

difficult, give oxygen. Get medical attention.

**Skin contact:** Immediately flush skin with plenty of water (using soap, if available). Remove

contaminated clothing and footwear. Wash clothing before reuse. Get medical

attention.

**Eye contact:** Rinse immediately with plenty of water, also under the eyelids, for at least 15

minutes. Get medical attention.

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#### 5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

## 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES
